The Donkeys of McLaren Flat

Henry the Donkey was a McLaren Flat Icon for many years. I decided to interview the current owner of Walker's Run Wines, Lucie Walker, to find out more.

Was Henry here when your family bought the vineyard?

My parent got our first donkey - Locket, who came from a donkey rescue shelter and hadn't been treated very well prior to coming to live at Mum and Dad's. They then bought Henry as donkeys don't like to be alone, so Henry was the companion for Locket. Locket died just before Mum and Dad left their property. Henry came to live with use when Mum and Dad left their property so that was about 7 years ago. We were so worried that he would be lonely when Locket died, but he had so many friends visit when he came to live with us on Ingoldby Road, that he wasn't lonely at all.

Your wine label has obviously been influenced by Henry's presence. Was he on the label when your family bought the vineyard or is that something that you put together?

When we decided to sell our wine commercially we asked Bud Design Studio to help us with our label, so they came to spend some time at the property and were really taken with Henry and how he had become a local celebrity. We decided he really needed to feature on our label as he was such a big part of our vineyard.

What was the deciding factor in getting 2 new donkeys?

We really weren't interested in getting another donkey as we didn't think we could ever replace Henry, however a friend passed on some information to us about 2 miniature donkeys that needed re-homing as their owner had died. We made enquiries about these 2 donkeys, but they found a place to live that was close to their original home in NSW. This really sparked the idea and made us think that it would actually be really nice for the legacy of Henry to live on in a miniature (and hopefully less cantankerous) version.

What made you decide on miniature donkeys this time? Where did they come from?

We got in touch with some lovely miniature donkey breeders in Dimboola and they sent through photos of Nora and a tiny Gus who had just been born. It was love at first sight!! Made even more special, by the fact that they had all the same colourings and markings of Locket.

Will you be changing the label to feature both donkeys?

Well...I think we will have to!

IT'S A WRAP AT WICKHAMS PARK

Filming of a new horror-thriller has finished in the local community.

The Pack, directed by commercial filmmaker Nick Robertson and starring Australian actors Jack Campbell and Anna Lise Phillips was shot on Wickham Park at 2 Wickhams Hill Road. Its story entails a family struggling to survive after their home is attacked by a pack of grisly dogs. The premise is based on real life accounts of feral dogs becoming more vicious. Apart from producer Kent Smith confirming this link, agricultural reports reveal that Australian farmers have indeed been suffering two to three attacks from wild dogs per week.

On the brighter side, the release of *The Pack* in the first half of next year is expected to renew interest in Wickham Park, a heritage-listed property. Dating back to the 1840s, the original farmhouse has weathered almost the entirety of McLaren Flat's 175-year history.

It was established by Benjamin Wickham, an English settler who sailed to Australia on the Africaine with his wife and three children. It has long since fallen into disuse - the current homestead (pictured) was built in 1903.

We know that Benjamin's son Daniel inherited the property after his father's death in 1875, going on to sell it to a Mr George Sauerbier almost thirty years afterward.

In 1998 – ninety-five years and a dynasty of Georges later - the Sauerbiers sold Wickham to Geoff Merrill, its present owner.

Though a seemingly tranquil past, the house actually suffered from a devastating fire in 1925, after which it was subsequently rebuilt.

Rosemount Ryecroft – August 2014

Rosemount Ryecroft winery is a significant member of the McLaren Flat community. Employing around 35 permanent staff - and up to 70 in vintage time - Rosemount is proud to call McLaren Flat home. With winter wrapping up and pruning all but done we look forward to seeing budburst across the region which heralds the new crop starting and new green growth on vines -- bring on Spring!

Rosemount's sustainability strategy involves a number of aspects, including a zero waste to landfill process, a wetlands which has experienced a rejuvenation recently, and a long term partnership with Cleland Wildlife Park. For over a decade, the woodlot just off Kangarilla road had been feeding the koalas at Cleland, as well as Rosemount employees volunteering annually at the wildlife park. Cleland are also close advisors to the 1000 native trees recently in the wetland area.

Rosemount is planning a community day in December this year, which among a number of activities will involve inspecting the more historic parts of the winery, dating back to the original establishment in 1888.

Rosemount has a Local Procurement Code, which looks at partnering and supporting the growth of businesses who provide goods and services to the winery. Stay tuned for more information in the coming months regarding events promoting the code.

Casuals are also welcome to apply for Vintage 2015, which commences on January and traditionally ends around April. There are already a number of McLaren Flat residents who join the team for Vintage.

OzHarvest expands to reduce food waste and spread goodness south of Adelaide

Food rescue charity OzHarvest Adelaide is expanding to rescue and deliver surplus food in the southern suburbs following the addition of a third van to its fleet. The expansion of OzHarvest into the southern region was made possible thanks to Colonnades Shopping Centre, which contributed \$50,000 towards the project.

Incredible support from industry leaders, Australian Hotels Association, and the generosity of the Jarvis Group and HomeGrain Bakery has allowed this project to come to life, helping to secure a brand new vehicle, an additional driver and operational support for the expanding food rescue program.

OzHarvestSA State Manager Hayley Everuss says the addition of the van, named Marigold, enables the organisation to provide a truly city-wide food rescue service within less than four years of OzHarvest beginning in Adelaide.

"We've just reached a milestone of delivering the equivalent of 2 million meals in central and northern Adelaide, and now we are adding a third van - never would we have anticipated that OzHarvest would grow so quickly in such a short timeframe," Ms Everuss said.

"The support within the southern region to meet the demand for food relief from charitable agencies, has been incredible. Without the financial support of Colonnades, the Australian Hotels Association, the Jarvis Group, the team at Home Grain Bakery and help from the City of Onkaparinga to introduce us to the community, we could not have put our third vehicle on the road."

Colonnades Centre Manager Zoltan Heinrich said teaming up with OzHarvest was a natural choice for the centre. "It made perfect sense to us because OzHarvest can help the southern community on so many levels - for those who struggle to feed themselves or their families, retailers who see good food go to waste each day simply because they can't sell it the next day, and for the environment," Mr Heinrich said.

"As centre manager I've seen first hand the quality of surplus produce that can be generated in a retail environment and so it is satisfying to know that now OzHarvest can provide an alternative that will directly benefit the local community."

The City of Onkaparinga has also worked alongside Colonnades and Home Grain Bakery to introduce OzHarvest to the region and garner support from other potential food donors and recipient charities.

About OzHarvest SA

OzHarvest continues to enjoy impressive growth since launching in South Australia in 2011. It is now rescuing on average 8000kg every week in the State and has delivered more than 2 million meals from 400 Adelaide food businesses and redistributed to 70 recipient charitable agencies. OzHarvest also operates in Sydney, Newcastle, Brisbane, Gold Coast and Melbourne.
